Dear Families,

Welcome to the Preschool room. The program in our room is based on the children's interests, and experiences. If you have any special activities that your child likes, or special activities that your Family participates in, e.g. holidays or celebrations, please let us know so that we can include these in our program.

The children are currently interested in the Natural environment. They have been helping to feed the tadpoles, and spent considerable time observing two Tawney Frogmouth owls that were perched in a tree near the back fence. Since the children have now settled well into the Preschool room's routines, we have included some tips to further assist their independence, and participation in the program.

Can your child -

dress and undress him/herself independently
put his/her shoes and socks on and find his/her own hat
identify his/ her own bag and belongings
put his/ her belongings inside his/her school bag and zip the bag shut
toilet independently, and wash hands
listen, follow simple directions, and stay focused to complete simple tasks, e.g take your hat off and put it in your bag
use a fork or spoon when eating
sit at the lunch table appropriately
answer when spoken to

•verbalise needs, and ask for help when needed

help to pack away activities

•select own activities to participate in

•play appropriately with others without hitting, pushing etc

•respect toys and equipment.

These are just some of the skills we encouraged the children to participate in (with lots of assistance and guidance of course) throughout the day.

Following through with these at home will really help the children accomplish these milestones, building their confidence while giving them a wonderful sense of achievement and independence.

A few quick reminders before we sign off...

*Remember to pack rest time sheets, hat, nappies/pull up's and a couple of changes of clothes each day your child attends care (all clearly labelled)

*Encourage your child to 'sign in' by choosing a locker and placing their photo inside, putting it back in the basket at the end of the day *Apply sunscreen before saying goodbye (don't forget to put a stamp on their hand)

NURSERY

Over the Christmas break we were lucky enough to have our nursery room painted and we think it looks fantastic. What a difference a new coat of paint makes! We feel the room looks much brighter, cleaner and fresher. We hope you like the change also.

Since starting back, the children have shown a great interest in animals. To extend on this we have included wooden zoo animals to inside play along with wild African animals to the sandpit during outside free play. We have read stories, completed simple puzzles and even created our own animals using playdough! Water play was introduced to inside play this week with ducks and boats as added accessories. Blue coloured water was provided in a tray for the children to experiment and explore. This was extremely popular as the children enjoyed 'bathing' the ducks and rowing the boats 'down the stream.' Just a few friendly reminders:

Please label all of your child's Day Care belongings please. These items include: Nappies, shoes, clothes, hats, bottles, dummies etc... This is very important to remember as it will help to eliminate any mix ups occurring and items going home in the wrong bags! So please check that all items are labelled
Sunscreen- There is a UV rating chart on our information board which will inform you every morning if sunscreen is or isn't need. If the chart reads 'yes' then PLEASE apply sunscreen to you child on arrival
A hat MUST be provided for your child EVERYDAY that they attend Day Care
Please provide numerous changes of clothes for your child. We encourage the children to participate in all sorts of activities ranging from water play, craft, self feeding, dirt and mud and this sometimes requires us to change their clothes, so please pack LOTS of spare clothes as we love to see the children having fun!
